Grilles – Wall or Ceiling mount

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

This grille is designed for surface mounting in wall or ceiling applications. Read all instructions before proceeding with installation.

AIRVECTOR

1. Opening preparation

• Cut an opening in the wall or ceiling to match the nominal size of the grille.

| The opening must be at the right shaped and clean

1.A. Gypsum (Drywall) Applications:

Ensure the opening has solid backing such as studs or blocking.

• If there is no stud where the grille will be mounted:

• Install blocking or reinforcement using angle iron on two (top/bottom or left/right) or all four sides depending on where mounting mouting holes are.

• Each angle iron should be approximately 1" to 1.5" longer than the opening width or height.

• Notch each end of the angle iron to allow proper clearance during installation.

1.B. Reinforcement (Inside Duct or Behind Drywall)

• Place one angle iron on the left and one on the right inside the duct, aligned vertically with the edges of the opening.

• You may also place reinforcement above and/or below the opening as needed.

• Ensure the angle iron extends equally beyond the edges on both sides of the opening.

• Fasten each angle using 3 or 4 sheet metal screws (by others).

• Pre-drill pilot holes in the angle irons if needed to avoid deformation during screw placement.

2. Fastening the grille

• Identify whether the grille's mounting holes are located along the length or width of the frame.

• Based on this, mark corresponding pilot hole locations on the wall or ceiling using a pencil.

• Drill pilot holes that align precisely with the grille's mounting holes.

| Optional: If additional holding strength is needed, install drywall anchors, toggle bolts, or wall plugs (by others) suitable for the surface type.

• Position the grille over the opening.

• Insert and tighten the screws through the grille's mounting holes and into the previously drilled pilot holes (or anchors).

• Ensure the grille is centered, level, and flush against the wall or ceiling surface.



3. Final checks

• Confirm that the grille is securely mounted and that all screws are tight.

• Verify that the grille is mounted securely and sits flush with the wall or ceiling.

• Confirm that airflow is unobstructed and centered within the duct.

4. Maintenance

• Clean the grille periodically using a soft cloth and mild soap solution.

- Do not use abrasive materials or harsh solvents.
- For removable-core grilles (if applicable), follow product-specific removal instructions for cleaning.
